SECTION C: Subject Selection Notes

Throughout the year, students study **twelve units**

- **EIGHT** units are compulsory and have been selected for you.
 - Two units in core Mathematics (full year)
 - Two units in core English (full year)
 - Two units in core Science (full year)
 - Two units in core HAPE & Humanities (full year – 2 sessions per week for HAPE and 2 sessions for HUMS)
- **TWO** units are electives. Students must select **one unit** from **each** of the following Learning Areas:
 - **Arts**
 - **Technology**
- **TWO** units are free choice

Free Choice:

- Students select two free choices, in order of preference from any of the eight Curriculum Learning Areas. Each elective will take up one unit of study. With the exception of Language which are two units each.
- Students may wish to accelerate by selecting a Year 10 elective subject. This could potentially make it easier for a student to attempt a VCE subject when they are in Year 10. However, for this to occur students must be 'At Level' or above in English, and excelling in the subject they wish to accelerate in already.
